Fire

- Fire Services responded to 28 Calls. 5 MVC's, 7 Medicals, 2 Burn Complaints, 4 Public Assists, 4 Public Hazards (power lines), 2 Fires, 4 Remote Alarms
- Total of 371 Incidents attended in 2023 compared to 306 for 2021.
- 2022 had a total of 1355 Burn Permits Issued. 213 Permits created so far for 2023.
- Recruit Orientation held January 4th. Interviews and Physical Evaluations completed January 10th and 12th.
- 133 Fire deaths in Ontario announced by the province for 2022. Most deaths due to not having working smoke alarms. Fire Chief and Fire Prevention working on some Township communications.
- Standby coverage for Gananoque Function due to equipment issues.
- Standby coverage for Athens Fire due to Fire Department function.
- Fire Chief enrolled in Labour Relations seminar Jan 24th, 25th & 26th in Toronto.
- Review of SOP's (Standard Operating Procedures) and SOG's (Standard Operating Guidelines) continuing with an emphasis on Accountability and Firefighter Safety.

Regional Training Center

- Fire Chief met with Brockville and Elizabethtown Kitley's Deputies to purchase
 Fire textbooks and resource material through the Fire Safety Council to be
 used at the Leeds RTC. This purchase is made possible through the Chief
 Officers Association of Leeds Grenville. This is the beginning stages of a Fire
 Service Library for all firefighters of the United Counties to have access to
 resource material managed through the Leeds RTC.
- Internal Firefighter II Course beginning Friday January 13th 18 members registered
- Fire Code Division B PT 3 & 5 beginning Saturday January 14th 9 students registered
- Proposals completed for all pending off site deliveries of Firefighter I and Firefighter II.
