Welcome, Introductions & Correspondence

John welcomed everyone. Each member introduced themselves and their Business's as per attendance list

Regarding Grant application: a non-disclosure statement had been signed therefore cannot be discussed until a Government press release.

Statement from Heiner Kammann: The incorporation of the Chamber this past year was a big step towards being able to acquire Government grants.

- 4. Twp update: Gord Ohlke was present and spoke on current issues, suggesting to Members to check the Twp website to keep up on Operations and Project deadlines.
- 5. Website report: Tanya Hammond was unavailable since she was attending a Farm Business meeting. Check the Chamber website to see that your business information is updated, current and correct. Members are encouraged to use the Chamber website for postings.

The Executive is examining the website platform and considering a change in 2023 to be compatible with mobile phones. Heiner Kammann is going to look for a website developer.

6. Mobile Tourist Kiosk Report: Ken Davies.

A mobile kiosk has been ordered but work on the project has been delayed. The two ladies, Vera Dulysh and Tara McMichael, who had been hired to represent

the Chamber in the summer kiosk in the Lyndhurst and Seeley's Bay area, were commended for a job well done.

Chamber Members are encouraged to print 'Rack Cards' as opposed to business size cards for better display in mobile kiosk.

Chamber members are encouraged to consider volunteering to work in the Mobile Kiosk to represent Chamber and promote own business.

7. Membership Report: Heiner Kammann.

There are 95 members to date. Heiner Kammann encourages Chamber members to be more active, and see the benefits of being a member.

Heiner suggested that the mobile kiosk can not only be informative to the public, but informative to chamber members; and are encouraged to see the value in it. There will be an Executive decision to increase membership fees in 2023. Last year it was \$100 per business; for 2023 a membership fee of \$125 +hst for 1 business to be implemented. *Add link to see Report for full pricing*

Ken Davies pointed out that Chamber membership allows for and pays into the Ontario and Canadian Chamber of Commerce.

8. Events Committee update: In 2023 the Chamber and Twp are partnering for the Turkey Fair.

The Events committee is to meet with Lawyer to assess how two incorporated entities can work together.

There are many things to do for the Turkey Fair and volunteers are sought to help run the event.

Santa Claus Parade will be taken over by the Chamber. The last Saturday in November was chosen as the date for the parade, to co-promote with the European Market to be held at Furnace Falls Farm.
