Another letter was received from PicRights International.

2. Aug Minutes: Irene Davelaar

Highlights of the August meeting minutes were read.

Annick Rousseau motioned that the minutes be accepted as read. Seconded by Ken Davies. A proxy vote was submitted by Heiner Kammann to accept the August Minutes. Passed.

3. Treasurer's Report: Annick Rousseau

A SeptemberTreasurer's Report was presented. Cheques have been written to LEAP Program participants, Advertising was paid for and a cheque for \$1,800.00 was received from Ontario Chamber as COVID related assistance. See attached Treasurers Report.

Tanya Hammond motioned to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Seconded by Irene Davelaar. A proxy vote was submitted by Heiner Kammann to accept the Treasurers report. Passed.

A 'Thank you' was extended to Annick for her work as Treasurer. The Chamber is still looking for a new Treasurer to take over next term. Annick is willing to stay on to assist in the transition.

4. Township Update: Kim Goodman

A very informative presentation was made on behalf of the Township by Kim Goodman on the extensive work being done for the business community and community as a whole.

4.1 The Economic Development Committee is in continued discussion with the St.Lawrence Corridor Economic Commission (a commission that looks to develop the area as a whole.); the Economic Development Committee seeking to receive full benefit of its membership;

developing a sound economic strategy that sustains the core and then addresses regional challenges.

- 4.2 The Township has been working with Gananoque on a 2 yr. project: Innovation through Commerce. An example of this is the Sunflower Campaign. In November there will be workshops made available on diverse opportunities for knowledge building such as Marketing, and reassessing account books.
- 4.3 There is Focus on Farmers Markets to engage and support the Agricultural Community. A kick off meeting will be in early October. October 5-11 is Ontario Agriculture Week.
- 4.4 The Township has received \$20,000.00 and is partnered with Gananoque for the Digital Mainstreet Program. A Program to support businesses on main streets; improving on-line presence and develop marketing tactics. Through this program, the Ontario Ministry of Recreation and Tourism Businesses will be in contact with 50-80 businesses over the next 3 to 4 months.
- 4.5 PEER meeting. There was a budget presentation at the meeting and work being done on Municipality Budget. The Casino being closed due to COVID has impacted revenue; emphasizing importance of capital projects. It is hoped to push Park projects.
- 4.6 Kim Goodman encouraged the Lyndhurst, Seeley's Bay & District Chamber to send in budget requests, and to champion local business events that welcome business and public to the area.

An Agenda of Economic Development Committee meetings will be made available to the Lyndhurst, Seeley's Bay Chamber Executive providing opportunity for input. Ken Davies added that he is willing to attend the Economic Development Committee meetings.

5. Membership update: Ken Davies / Annick Rousseau

There are 77 members to date. The Recruiting Drive will begin in October. John Sideris proposed keeping the membership fee at \$75 for 2021, with no late fees included and raising the membership fee in 2022. Discussion was held.

Ken Davies motioned that Membership fee be \$75 for 2021 and the fee of any new 2020 members will cover the remainder of 2020 as well as 2021. Membersip fees to be raised in 2022. Seconded by Tanya Hammond. Passed.

6. LEAP update: John Sideris

Fall being a good marketing time, businesses are selling more Gift Certificates. The urgency being to inject more dollars into local small business, continued sponsorship will be solicited.

7. Web Site/Facebook: Tanya Hammond

Tanya attended a RTO 9 Tourism Conference on-line. Points presented valid for the current times:

- Consider residents feelings (as to COVID concerns) when making decisions by focusing on regional customers as opposed to farther afield.
- Start advertising to residents who would generally be snowbirds; message indicating 'this is what you can do close to home'.
- Reminded that each can be an ambassador for others.
